The company has appointed a health and safety manager who will be the point of contact within the company for implementing the health and safety policy on a daily basis.

The company will ensure sufficient funds are provided at all levels to meet these aims and objectives

All employees, sub-contractors and third parties are encouraged to contribute towards achieving a work environment that is free of accidents and ill-health by active involvement in our safety culture.

Our health and safety policy will be reviewed annually to ensure that it maintains the highest standards of safety in the industry and that it reflects any changes in legislation or revisions in industry best practice.
